#### **MUSINGS FROM THE MANSE (DECEMBER 2024)**

This Christmas I'm so grateful to have been part of the worship and celebrations at APC. It's been a real privilege to welcome so many visitors to our church. We never take for granted that the school's Infant Nativity happens in church, with a full audience of parents. More unusually, we also host two Christmas services for the secondary school, welcoming about 450 teenagers who never come to church. This year's services were particularly well received. I knew that when I went into a shop next day and was accosted (in the nicest possible way) by a teenager I don't know. She said "That was a really good service yesterday", told me what she liked about it, and concluded, "We should do that kind of thing more often!" I resisted the temptation to tell her we do it every Sunday (we don't, or not that kind of service) but the positive impact on a generation of totally unchurched young people left a very warm feeling – a seed to grow in future.

This year for the first time we also hosted the school's annual musical concert. (It's been at Gleneagles, but they decided to go upmarket this year). Another full event, and I had the unusual experience of being escorted to my allocated seat in my own church by a respectful pupil. Someone entering the church said, "I've never been in here before – this is beautiful." Others also remarked over coffee that it was their first time in the Church Centre. Thanks to Peter, who was in church that day sound checking the rehearsals and performance from 8am-9.30pm, I'd like to modestly claim that we rivalled Gleneagles for hospitality, and I hope they come back next year.

Other Christmas services were well attended and much enjoyed, from a lovely Nativity led by Michelle, a celebratory Christmas Day service led by Alan and Christingles for the Crib Service with Sandra. Singing "Silent Night" with a church full of lit Christingles as our only light was magical! Yet my personal favourite remains the Watchnight Service. I love the total randomness of it – you never know who will turn up. We opened the doors and 160 people came through, at least 100 of whom I had never seen in my life before. We had visitors from Dubai, Madrid, Alabama and Blackford. People visiting family, people on holiday, locals who never come any other time but who feel the twitch on the thread at Watchnight. One young woman arrived very early and said, "I always come to this – and I lost my mum this year – I just need to sit....". People in full dress kilt and people in reindeer headdresses. This year I was halfway through the service when 4 men in tuxedos and a woman in a silver evening dress entered at the



back. The only free seats were in the front row, so they came on down. Later they explained apologetically that they had ordered a taxi to Our Lady's for midnight mass. Finding the church empty, the driver suggested us! A motley gathering of the faithful, the curious, the casual, the tourist.....a bit like Bethlehem. And at that service, we always go again to the manger, to experience the wonder again. It's the service that gets to the heart of it.

So my own heart is a little bit full. Some of these people we'll see again, some we won't. We pray that we're a link in a chain or a little spark of light that, like the baby's birth, might come to fulfilment years later. We plant the seeds, God waters them, and God's word never returns to him empty. We just keep looking for ways to make Jesus known in our community – and may be surprised that it's a blessing to us too!

#### DNA Groups at APC – starting late January

#### What's a DNA group?

Churches changing and closing all around us makes us think: what is church, really? What are the essential ingredients without which we cannot be church? It's a bit like human DNA, the basic template in every human cell. Pared down to essentials, church is **Discipleship – Nurture – Action.** 

**Discipleship**: following Jesus, prayer and Bible reading to form a Christian lifestyle. **Nurture**: doing that in caring relationships with other people on the journey **Action**: focusing outwards, seeking opportunities to serve God in mission and social action.

We've run DNA groups 3 times before in APC. People meet in small cells of 3, once a week for a short time (about 45 minutes). Feedback has been really positive so we're doing it again, staring late January.

#### What will the groups do?

A simple leaflet outlines the shape of each group's meeting. **Nurture** (coffee and chat) - about 15 mins **Discipleship** - Bible reading and discussion – 15 mins **Action** – Supporting a mission or social action project, and praying together (10-15 mins)

The Bible readings will be the same as the sermons those weeks, but people who don't come to church can easily take part.

#### How do they meet?

DNA groups are totally flexible. You can meet any time and any place – over breakfast, at a kitchen table, around another activity that you're doing together anyway. It helps if it's a place where you can pray together. You don't even have to meet at the same time every week – but you should be <u>committed to</u> <u>meet together weekly for 5 weeks</u>. Short and easy for busy people!

#### How do groups form?

Stretch out your two arms to whoever is nearest you: friends or neighbours, Guild or choir members, elder's districts, Messy Church, whoever – and ask if they'd like to be your DNA group? Single sex groups work best, and more than 3-4 people becomes a "meeting". Alternatively, if you want to be in a group you can let us know and we will make or find one for you. Exact dates are still TBC but plan to take the plunge – and invite a friend! For more info contact Lynn, or Margaret Ross <u>magsross1711@gmail.com</u>




#### Festive Coffee morning
