Musings from the Manse - February 2025.

Yesterday I attended a gathering in Edinburgh of over 200 Church of Scotland ministers, almost half the ministers in Scotland. It was an afternoon and evening conference with dinner, the first of its kind. Coming the same week as news of more cuts to our central support services and staff, it aimed to give an opportunity for sharing, encouragement, inspiration and listening to God's Word. There were also seminar slots where we could meet those in "management" to ask questions, or explore good practice in different areas of church life. We were helped to remember what church is really all about – making disciples of Jesus, and with them, taking his good news to our communities.

I thought it did pretty well what it tried to do. Church meetings nowadays are nearly always online so it was good to discover that new colleagues exist below the neck, and to reconnect with some others I've known for years but not seen since COVID. I realised again how blessed we are in Auchterarder to still have our own church and minister with no linkages or unions — that's quite a rare privilege, and not guaranteed to last forever.

But I didn't need the conference to tell me what church is really all about. Stuart and I have seen that in APC so strongly since his illness – so many cards, messages, flowers, dog walks, visits and other kind gestures. And home baking and dinners – we've never eaten so well! And over and above all of that, all the reminders that we are prayed for. It's strange but true that you can know when you're being prayed for, and we both sense that strongly. Stuart is improving steadily and able to do most everyday tasks, though he tires very easily. Proper healing will take many months and lots of physio, and golf is out for this year! The love and support of all our friends but particularly our church family has been deeply moving and reminds us of the best bits about being a church. We want to try to convey our deepest thanks to you all. We feel very loved.

We also do discipleship at APC. I'm disappointed not to have been in a DNA group but so pleased that over 30 people have done it and looking forward to hearing how it went next Sunday afternoon over tea. If you missed out, all of us



will be reading Luke's Gospel for Lent from next week, so join in with that! And we do mission. One aspect of that, our



church café, has been going really well with relationship being built with regular customers who aren't church people but enjoy our welcome. Such a success that we do need more volunteers — anyone out there thinking about that?

So with church nationally presenting huge challenges, we still do family, discipleship and mission locally as best we can. I think it's a fantastic blessing to be part of a church and I hope you agree. Especially ours, though I probably shouldn't say that!

The hope of the ladies of the Cook Islands is that the world will come to treat all people as "Fearfully and wonderfully made"



APC Community Garden – Feb Update – Preparing for Spring

Communal Garden The materials promised by PKC are all on order so we are poised for an exciting project to create a Potager garden. A Potager garden is one where the planting is designed to be both ornamental (nice to look at) and productive (veg to eat and flowers to cut), like the example in the photo. Ours will also be wildlife friendly with planting chosen for their value to pollinators. We will be creating the

garden through the spring and summer so if you are interested in 'potagering' please get in touch and share in its creation. A key aspect of this project is to provide a seat where people can sit, relax and take it all in. In the back ground the routine of preparing the rest of the garden for the coming growing season has continued so mulching with well-rotted manure, covering with sheeting to keep the weeds down and warm the beds ready for planting.

Mini-allotments All 10 of our mini-allotments are now let and so we now have a waiting list and can offer opportunities in the Communal

garden whilst folk wait for a 'mini' to come available. Our mini's are poised for the growing season with beds cleared and covered just waiting for the time to plant. This year there will be a 'demo' bed which they can copy if they wish with hints and tips on our Facebook page. One of the minis is planted up for cut flowers and the



spring bulbs are just about to reward the time and effort of planting. Not to be outdone the Communal garden also has a cut flower strip where the daffodils and tulips are about to put on a wonderful display.

It's becoming clear that our vegetable growing enterprise could do with some more ground, more space means more veg' to share. If you have a space in your garden, no matter how big or small, please get in touch if you would be willing to allow us to grow some vegetables there. No need to worry, we will do all the work!


Kidsteam meet after the children's hymn in the Church Centre every Sunday morning. Lots of games, craft, drama and fun.
